Also, talk with people who have experience studying abroad. And call the school to **make sure** someone can meet you when you get there. Make sure to bring some local money and a credit card.

## Once you are there

- 30 Be curious and open to meeting new people and having new experiences. Don't expect to always be **comfortable**. After the first few weeks it's usual to feel a little homesick.<sup>3</sup> You'll **miss** your family and friends. Remember that it takes time to get used to a new place with new customs. Talk to your new friends and write about your feelings. Try to keep in touch with the people back home.
